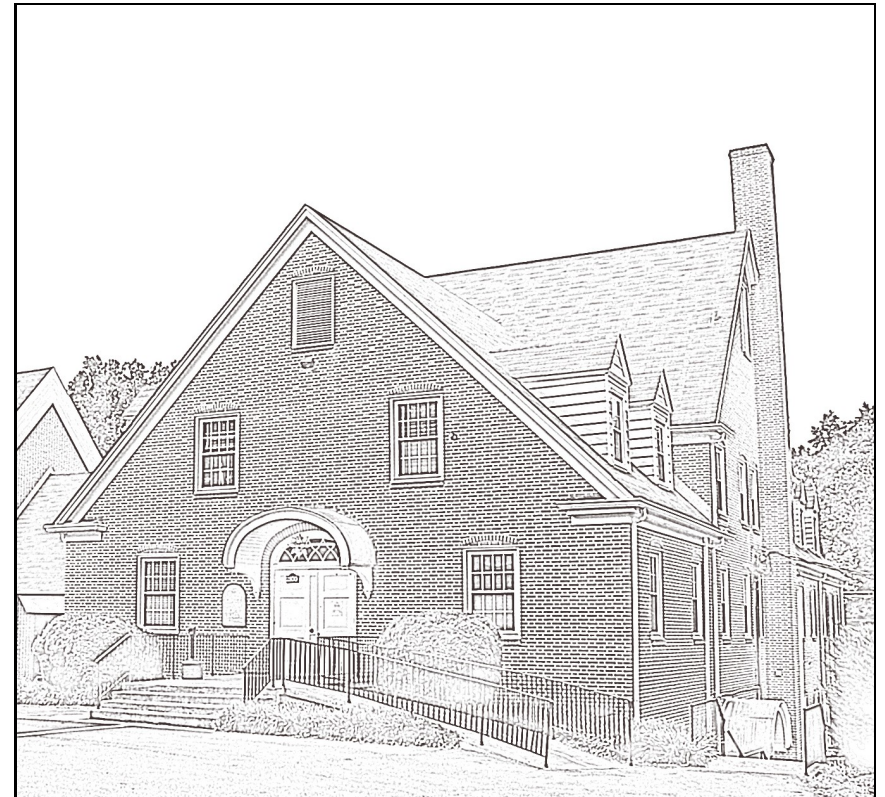

Acts 2:1-21

2 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. **2** And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. **3** And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. **4** And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

5 Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. **6** And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. **7** And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?" **8** And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? **9** Par'thians and Medes and E'lamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappado'cia, Pontus and Asia, **10** Phryg'ia and Pamphyl'ia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyre'ne, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and prose-lytes, **11** Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." **12** And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"

Acts 2:1-13

2 Cuando llegó el día de Pentecostés,† estaban todos unánimes juntos. **2** Y de repente vino del cielo un estruendo como de un viento recio que soplaba, el cual llenó toda la casa donde estaban sentados; **3** y se les aparecieron lenguas repartidas, como de fuego, asentándose sobre cada uno de ellos. **4** Y fueron todos llenos del Espíritu Santo, y comenzaron a hablar en otras lenguas, según el Espíritu les daba que hablasen.
