Dusty Harrison Serving with Greek InterVarsity

Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus from the campus of The College of William & Mary in Williamsburg, VA. I have spent the past year working as an intern at William & Mary with Greek InterVarsity, a ministry of InterVarsity Christian Fellowship that reaches out specifically to college fraternity and sorority students. InterVarsity is an interdenominational campus ministry that has been reaching college students with the Gospel since 1941.



My internship is a one-year program designed to help transition recent graduates into life after college and to train potential campus ministers for full-time ministry. Words can hardly describe the growth and affirmation I've received from working with Greek InterVarsity, all of which has led me to accept a full-time position to plant a brand new ministry at Clemson University beginning this fall. Here is a brief overview of the ministry:

The Need:

- There are approximately 750,000 Fraternity and Sorority students on college campuses across the United States.
 - 9 million members (current and alums)

- 750,000 undergraduate
- 12,000 chapters
- 800 campuses
- Though fraternity and sorority students make up less than 3% of the U.S. population, Greek alumni make up:
 - 48% of all U.S. Presidents
 - 42% of U.S. Senate which is 30% of Congress
 - 40% of all U.S. Supreme Court Justices
 - 30% of Fortune 500 executives

Our Response:

Our mission is to reach this entirely unique culture of fraternity and sorority students, which has historically been closed off as pagan, with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

How do we do this?

- By leading and training them in evangelism and missions (relational).
- By training them in in-depth personal and group Bible studies.
- By discipling them one-on-one and in small groups.
- By training them in biblical leadership and then encouraging

them to lead their peers.

How can you help?

I cannot do this ministry alone. I need a team of people behind me to whom God has given the gift of giving and support. That can take many forms—perhaps you are able to serve through:
