background for him to serve as the on-site manager for this project. In addition, he has lived in Honduras for several years, knows the language, and has an understanding of Miskito culture. Also, he has experience in establishing small businesses that provide employment and income for individuals in La Mosquitia. Brother Griggs will:

- Supervise start-up of the well-drilling business,
- Train local workers to drill the wells and to teach recipients how to keep their well functioning (He will personally drill the first 6 wells and use the process to teach local workers),
- Handle the administrative role (money, pricing, reports, decisions, etc.),
- Work closely with Moravian Church leaders to elicit their support,
- Join with his wife, Laurie, to edu-

cate people regarding the importance of clean water, and

- Maintain ownership of the project until such time as there are Miskito employees who have sufficient knowledge of well-drilling, as well as the necessary business skills, to assume management of the project.

Teaching people about the benefits of clean water is an essential component of this project. There are many challenges to face. Many Miskito people continue to feel that “sickness comes from a curse from the local witchdoctor, NOT from drinking dirty water”. Laurie’s degree in Health Education will help her in facilitating the educational component. She has good contacts at private and public schools around Puerto Lempira where she plans to explore an education effort to teach school children about the need for clean water. Also, Ray and Laurie plan to visit the Honduran Government Region 8 Health Office in Puerto Lempira to learn what that of-

ice is doing concerning water. They hope to compliment and build off the Health Office’s efforts. Finally, when the project is funded, radio ads will be used talk about the benefits of clean water as well as the well-drilling business. *For more info, contact the Little Church on the Lane.*
