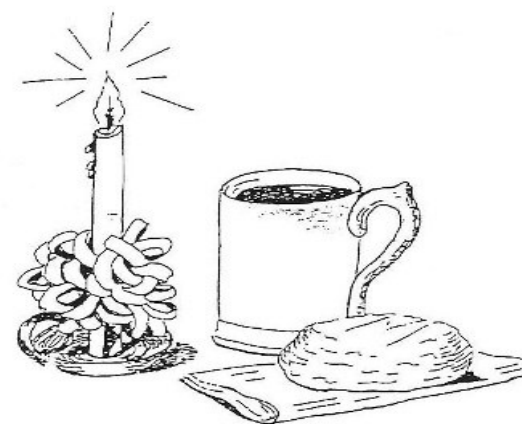

We had a busy day today. The weather was nice and people started lining up in the parking lot at 5:00am! We don't open until 10am and by then we had about 10 people waiting in line to shop. In order to give everyone who came a chance to shop, we had to limit their shopping time to 10 minutes. Our racks were full and our homegoods section had been replenished so it was very hard to shop the entire area in just 10 minutes. But we had a total of 35 shoppers who managed to gather a total of 593 articles. When we closed at noon, we still had 6 shoppers to finish so we were there until around 12:30pm.

Earlier this month, someone came to the church while our Administrative Assistant was working. This young lady had just had a baby and had just gotten out of the hospital, and when she got home, someone had broken in and had stolen all her clothes and her baby's clothes. Needless to say, Linda let her in and let her shop. She was very grateful and was able to find what she needed.

Our little church is a blessing to so many, and the need is growing. Our Women's Fellowship did a blanket drive to help keep the unhoused warm. We will be donating those blankets to The Dream Center on Liberty Street next week. They have a very large unhoused population, and distribute around 1,000 items each week. Thank you for your support and your donations so we can continue our important clothing ministry!
